

Salisbury Conservation Commission Meeting Summary October 26, 2022

Chairman Dave Kelly called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

<u>Previous Meeting Minutes</u> - Members reviewed the May 31, 2022 meeting minutes. <u>Member Bill MacDuffie motioned to accept the meeting minutes</u>. <u>Chairman Dave Kelly seconded that motion</u>. <u>All voted in favor</u>. <u>Motion carried</u>. Members reviewed the June 22, 2022 meeting minutes. <u>Member Bill MacDuffie motioned to accept the meeting minutes</u>. <u>Member Sarah John seconded that motion</u>. <u>All voted in favor</u>. <u>Motion carried</u>.

<u>Old Business</u> - Mike Rossetti gave an update regarding the Cyanobacteria bloom on Tucker Pond. He said it had returned and beavers had moved into the area. There has been a large amount of rain leading to excessive runoff, which in turn may lead to higher bloom levels. A pre-proposal for a grant to study the situation has been submitted.

VRAP has concluded for the year. The equipment was returned to NHDES by Secretary Cheryl Bentley.

<u>New Business</u> - Visitors Michael Rossetti and Paula Munier Lee have both expressed interest in joining the Salisbury Conservation Commission. **Secretary Cheryl Bentley made a motion to nominate both Michael Rossetti and Paula Munier Lee and recommend to the Board of Selectmen to appoint both to the Salisbury Conservation Commission. Member Kathleen Doyle seconded that motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.**

Members expressed concern over a possible wetland violation on Bay Road. As the Conservation Commission can file a complaint as a town entity, the board agreed that we would investigate what is required for a formal complaint.
