

## SALISBURY NH CEMETERIES

*“Formerly the dead were buried about the church where they worshipped or in some retired place on the home lot; but as times changed this was gradually done away with.” -Chapter XXVII The Cemeteries from the History of Salisbury NH by John J Dearborn 1890.*

### THE SEARLE'S HILL CEMETERY

Derived in part from the History of Salisbury:

The first Church in Salisbury, and one attended by the early settlers including the Websters, was on the summit of Searle's Hill. The land east and south of the building was used as the burial ground for many years and it was referred to as Searle's Hill Graveyard. The Church was dismantled and moved to the present location at the four corners crossroads of Route 4 & Route 127 in Salisbury. Because of its difficult location and the existence of new graveyards with better access within the town, the cemetery was discontinued. Stones were removed, the ground was plowed and there isn't any evidence of its existence at this site. Information derived from the History of Salisbury.

Originally the eastern boundary of Salisbury was the Merrimack River and the Webster Farm and Shaw Corner Cemeteries were part of Salisbury until the forming of the City of Franklin in 1828. Specific inquiries regarding both cemeteries should be made to the City of Franklin.

The Rowe and Jones Graveyard on Flaghole Rd. is technically right over the town line in Andover and originally was given a Salisbury Cemetery code. It is included now only because it is so close to the line and is quite interesting, however again all inquiries should be made to the town of Andover for the Rowe and Jones Cemetery
