

FELLOWS CEMETERY S02-003

LOCATION: At crossroads of Route 127 and Route 4 go left on Route 127 south towards Webster. Cemetery is on the left. Open access. Approximately 54 graves, possibly more. According to the writings of Dr. Paul Shaw, the family felt there may be stones missing of some of the early persons thought to be buried there. Good condition.



MILLS or PINGREE CEMETERY S02-005

LOCATION: Located in the area known as West Salisbury on Mill Road south of Pingree Bridge. Left side of the road. Open access. Additional area was created for current use. Well maintained.

The Pingree Yard was given by William Pingree, Sr., with the proviso that he was to have the north front lot and his son Stephen the south front lot. It was fenced by the neighbors, and, in 1880, an addition on the south was made by John Huntoon.-The History of Salisbury New Hampshire collated by John J Dearborn 1890
