

WEBSTER FARM CEMETERY (Now in Franklin NH)

According to John Dearborn-History of Salisbury:

The first interment within the limits of Salisbury was at the Lower village and was that of the remains of four soldiers who died as early as 1754, at the the Old Fort. It is supposed that the wife of Philip Call, the first settler in Salisbury lived just west of the WEBSTER CEMETERY in what is now west Franklin. The burial spot of his wife who was killed by Indians in 1754 was probably buried near the cabin in an unmarked grave. Several of the early Salisbury settlers, including Daniel Webster's parents are buried in the WEBSTER CEMETERY in west Franklin. Several of the Salisbury settlers moved north a few miles and settled in what was then Andover. Many are buried in a small cemetery on the side of US 3A /2 mile north of the junction of 3A an N11 in Franklin.

LOCATION: Route 3 north from Boscawen into Franklin. Turn right at Webster Place. Access through field towards the Merrimack River. Open access by foot.

SHAW CORNER 1784 (original designation S02-011, Now in Franklin H)

LOCATION: Heading west on Route 127 from Franklin towards Salisbury take first right past the Birthplace Road (North road). Name of the street is Easy Street. Cemetery in on the left shortly after the turn.



ROWE AND JONES GRAVESITES (Original designation S02-007, actually in Andover NH)

LOCATION: Graveyard on Flag Hole Hill in Andover at Salisbury Andover border, corner of Flag Hole Road and Humphrey Road. Access and condition: good. Iron work fencing, graves clustered now around large trees. Stone must have fallen early on as the tree has grown around it making an interesting sight.

Resting place of 1) Benjamin Rowe died Aug 5, 1827, Lydia died Aug 12 1860, Enoch Jones died Oct. 7, 1884 ae 73, *Eliza C. wife of Enoch Jones died Feb. 3, 1899 ae 88

Benjamin Rowe was the son of Nathan Rowe born Nov 12 1779 in Hampton Falls NH and died Aug 25 1827 Andover NH. His mother was Lydia Page. He was the son of Nathan Rowe (who was a soldier in the Louisburg Campaign) and was born in Hampton Falls in 1725, died Andover NH 1809, married to Lydia Page who died in 1812.

Benjamin Rowe was the grandson of Robert Rowe Jr and Mehetable Swayne of Hampton Falls.-From the History of the Town of Andover New Hampshire, 1751-1906 Author: Eastman, John R. (John Robie), 1836-1913; Emery, George Edwin, 1829-1900

Lydia Rollins was the daughter of Jotham Rollins son of Moses Rollins from Rye and Sandbornton. and Keizah Burleigh From: DESCENDANTS OF GILES BURLEY.
